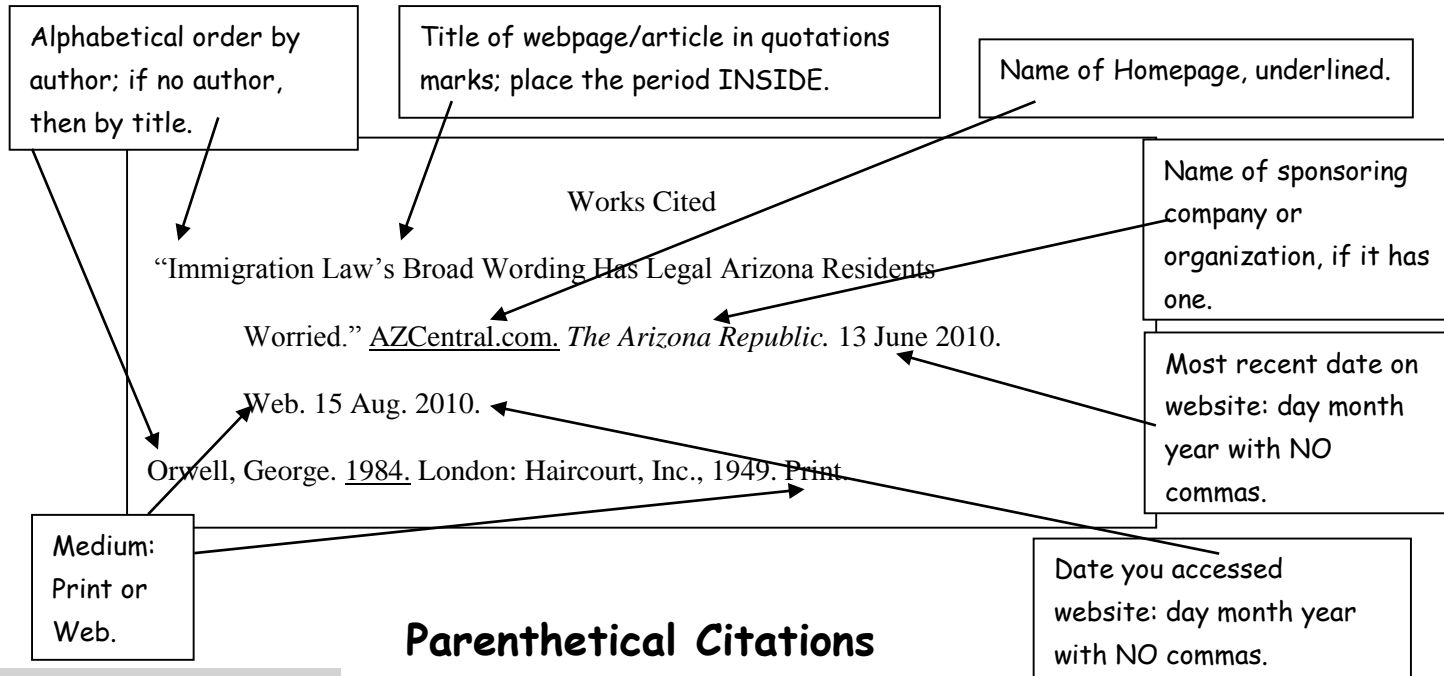


Works Cited

- Times New Roman, size 12 font
- List entries in **alphabetical** order by author's last name; if no author, then by title.
- **Do NOT** use bullet points, numbers, etc.
- **Double space** all entries (There are no extra spaces between entries.)
- **Indent:** If the entry takes more than one line, then **indent the second line** by hitting "enter" then "tab" once.
- **Include all required information in correct order with correct capitalization and punctuation**
- If certain publishing information is not present on the source, then you must **skip it** and move on to whatever is next.



Parenthetical Citations

Three Rules to Cite By:

1. Look at the first word/s for the source's entry on the Works Cited page, and those will be what you write inside of the parenthesis. **If there is an author**, the last name will be in the parenthesis. If there is **no author**, then the first words of the title will be in the parenthesis.
 2. If the text came from a **website**, put the **PARAGRAPH** number. **ONLY** put a space and the abbreviation *par.* in between the name or title and the paragraph number (Barnes *par.* 3). (“Themes, Motifs, & Symbols” *par.* 4).
- If the text came from a **book** or magazine, put the **PAGE** number. **ONLY** put a space in between the name or title and the page number (Orwell 188).
3. The **period** goes **OUTSIDE/AFTER** the parenthesis at the **END** of the sentence that is being cited.

If the works cited looks like this...	Then the sentence in the text should be cited like this...
Orwell, George. <u>1984</u> . London: Haircourt, Inc., 1949. Print.	Blah blah blah blah blah blah blah (Orwell 3).
“Immigration Law’s Broad Wording Has Legal Arizona Residents Worried.” <u>AZCentral.com</u> . <i>The Arizona Republic</i> . 13 June 2010. Web. 15 Aug. 2010.	Blah blah blah blah blah blah blah (“Immigration Law’s” <i>par.</i> 7).

Website, Online, or Electronic Source

Author's Last Name, First Name . "Title of Text/Article." Title of Homepage that Had the Text/Article .

→ Name of Publishing Company or Organization Supporting the Website . Day
Abbreviated Month . Year Website Was Created/Updated . Medium (Web)
Day . Abbreviated Month . Year You Looked up Website .

Book or Textbook

Author's Last Name, First Name . Name of Book . City of Publication .

→ Name of Publication Company , Year of Publication . Medium (Print) .

Newspaper or Magazine in Print

Author's Last Name, First Name . "Title of Article." Title of Source that Had the Article .

→ Day . Abbreviated Month . Year Article Was Printed . Volume # .
Page # - # . Medium (Print) .
